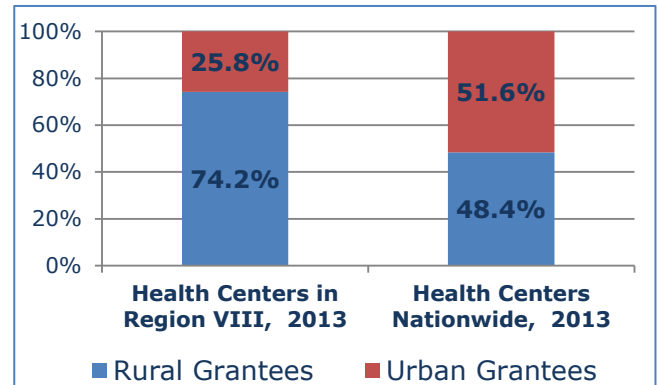
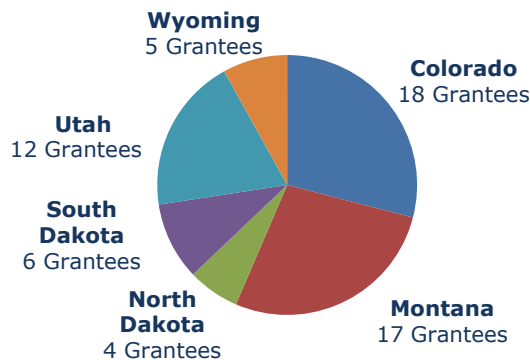
Region VIII = Colorado, Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Utah, and Wyoming

The health centers within the Bureau of Primary Health Care (BPHC) **Health Center Program** provide high-quality, affordable, and accessible primary health care, most often to indigent, medically underserved, and underinsured populations in a wide range of communities, from inner cities to rural expanses. As of 2013 there are more than **1,200** health center organizations operating over **8,500** sites in the United States, serving over **21 million** people. These include community health centers, school-based health centers, migrant health centers, health care for the homeless centers, and public housing primary care centers. Each of these health centers must:

- Be located in area of high need*
- Be open to all regardless of ability to pay*
- Provide services that fit the needs and priorities of the community*
- Offer primary care and other services to ensure access (translation, transportation, etc.)*
- Provide high quality care, reducing disparities and improving patient outcomes*

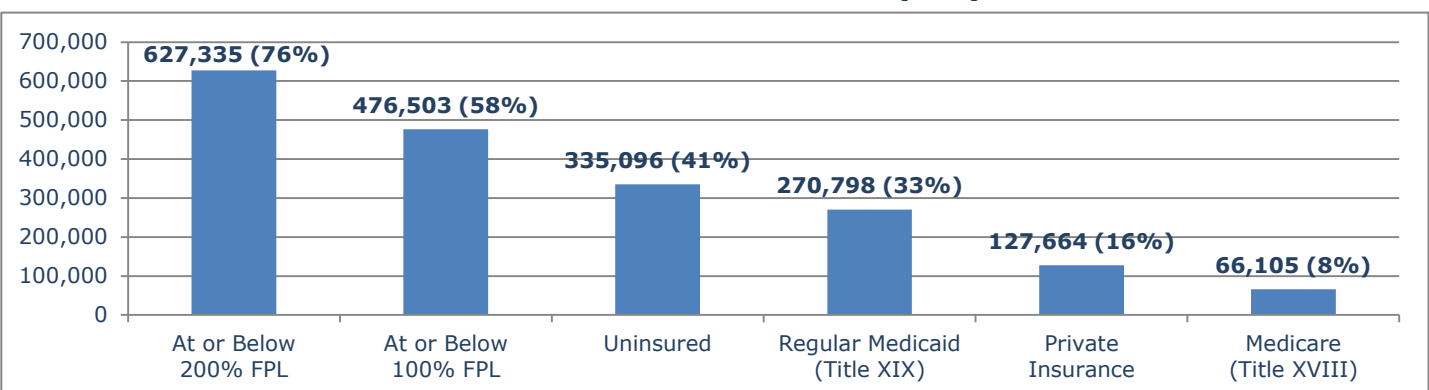
LOCATION OF REGION VIII HEALTH CENTERS

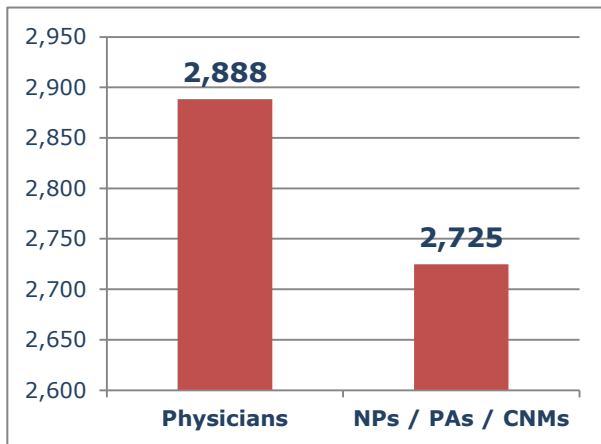

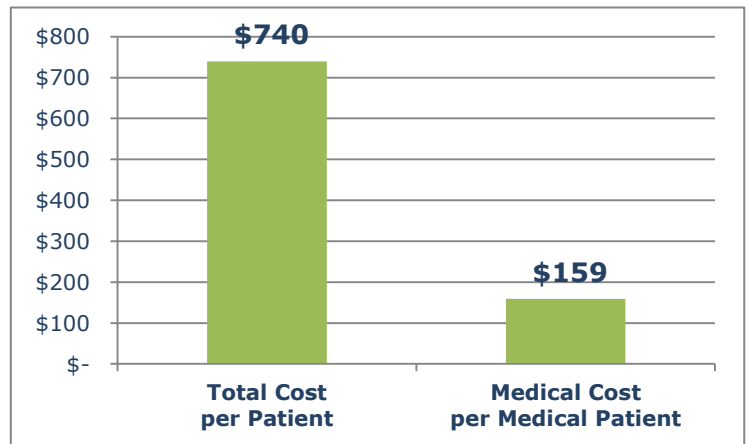

REGION VIII MEDICAL PROVIDER PRODUCTIVITY (VISITS/FTE)

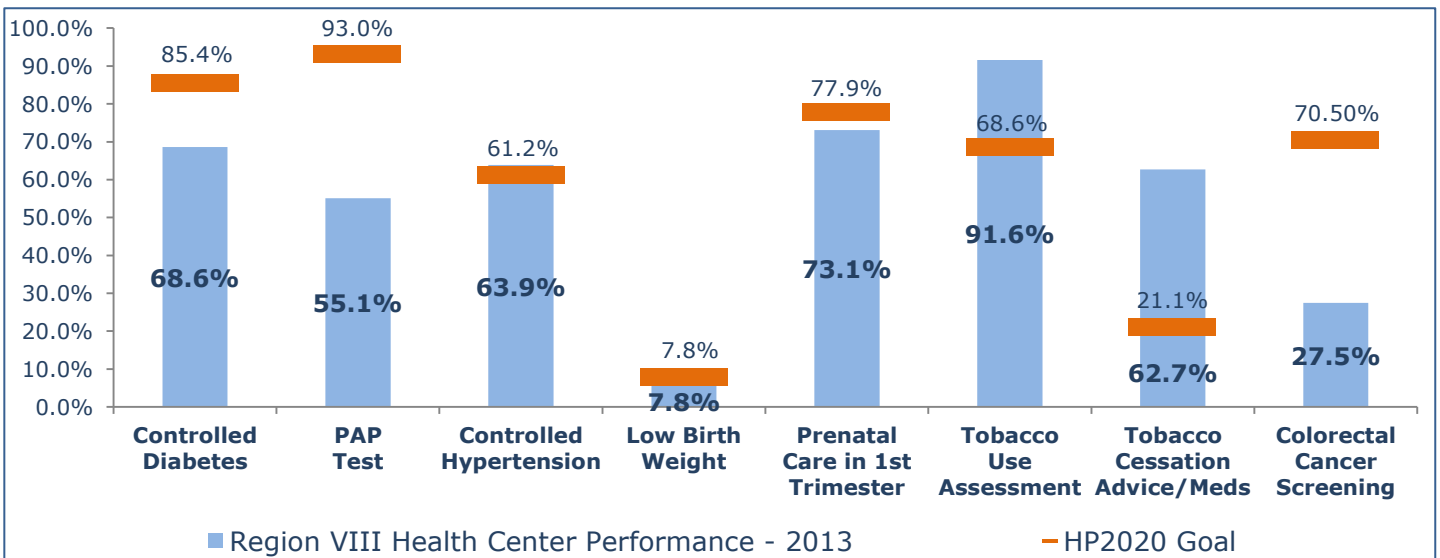


REGION VIII PERFORMANCE ON SELECTED BUSINESS PLAN PERFORMANCE MEASURES
