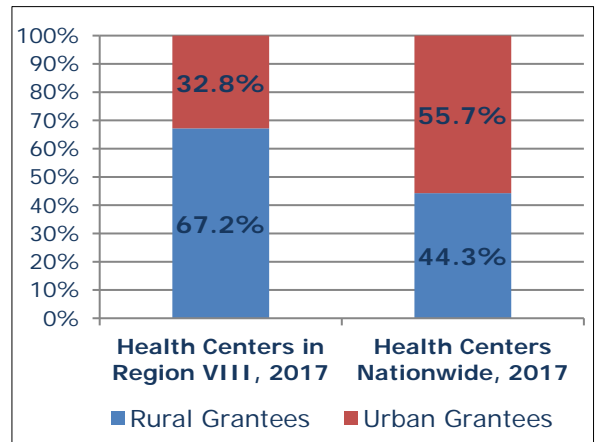
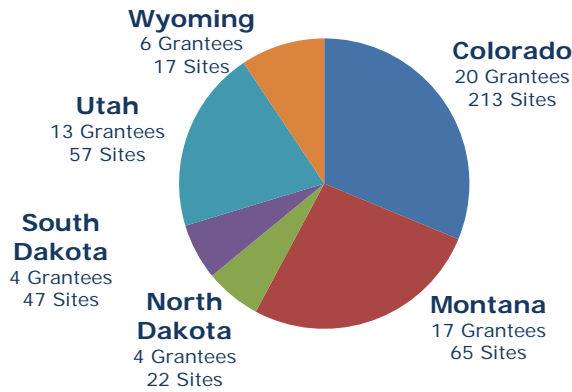
Region VIII: Colorado, Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Utah, and Wyoming

The health centers within the Bureau of Primary Health Care (BPHC) **Health Center Program** provide high-quality, affordable, and accessible primary health care, most often to indigent, medically underserved, and underinsured populations in a wide range of communities, from inner cities to rural expanses. As of 2017 there are more than **1,370** health center organizations operating in the United States, serving over **27.1 million** people. These include community health centers, school-based health centers, migrant health centers, health care for the homeless centers, and public housing primary care health centers. Each of these health centers must:

- Be located in area of high need.*
- Be open to all regardless of ability to pay.*
- Provide services that fit the needs and priorities of the community.*
- Offer primary care and other services to ensure access (translation, transportation, etc.).*
- Provide high quality care, reducing disparities and improving patient outcomes.*

REGION VIII HEALTH CENTERS IN 2017 – 64 TOTAL GRANTEEES

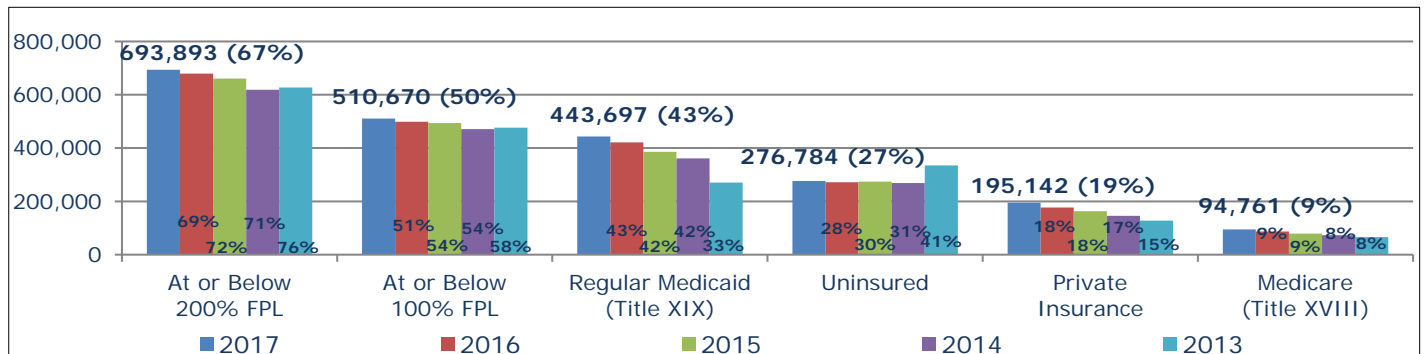
LOCATION OF REGION VIII HEALTH CENTERS

REGION VIII PATIENTS BY FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL (FPL) AND INSURANCE

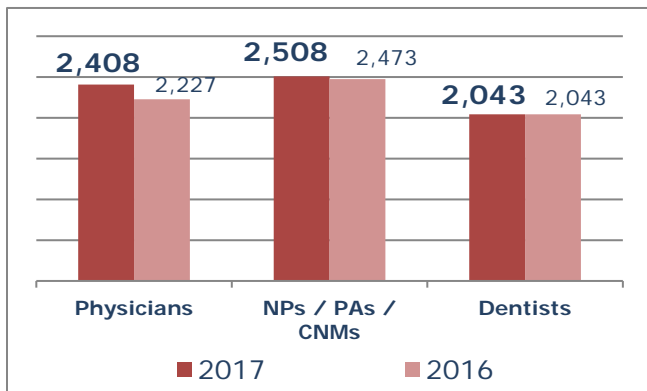

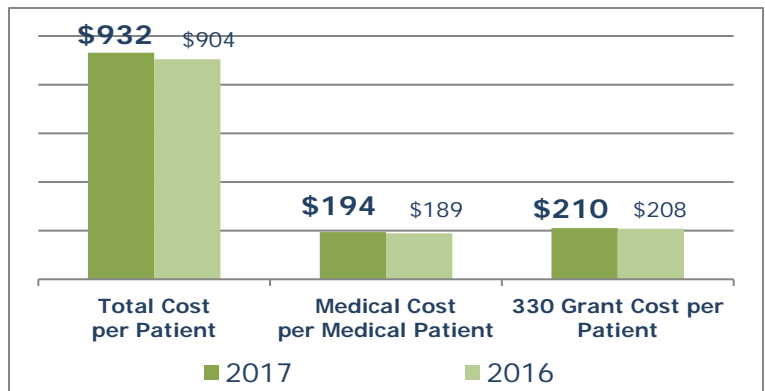

REGION VIII MEDICAL AND DENTAL PRODUCTIVITY (VISITS/FTE)

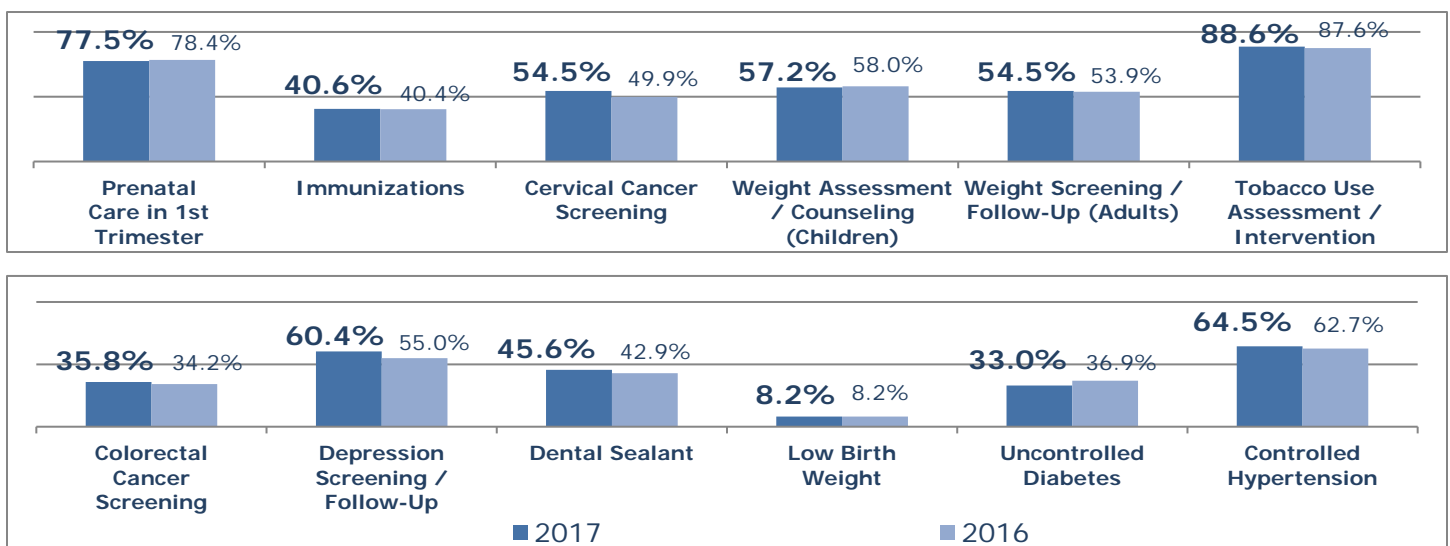


REGION VIII PERFORMANCE ON FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE MEASURES
