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Now Open: 2026 CHAMPS/NWRPCA Fall Primary Care Conference Registration



CHAMPS invites you to register for the [2026 CHAMPS/NWRPCA Annual Fall Primary Care Conference](#), taking place from October 24-27 in Salt Lake City, UT. Each year, CHAMPS partners with Northwest Regional Primary Care Association (NWRPCA) to host a primary care conference designed to address the needs of Region 18 (Regions VIII and Region X) health center staff and board members.

This year's event will include a pre-conference workshop addressing the 340B program (*see page 2 for more information*), a variety of educational and networking sessions, exhibits from industry experts, and a community health center tour. The conference will also feature several keynote speakers, including Tonya Bowers, Associate Administrator of the Bureau of Primary Health Care, and Dr. Luis Padilla, Chief Health Officer at the National Association of Community Health Centers.

Educational sessions will be offered across a variety of tracks such as Board Governance, Clinical, Finance, Healthy Communities, Hot Topics, Human Resources/Workforce, Leadership, and Operations (*see page 3 for highlights of the sessions offered in each track*).

Staff and board members from [CHAMPS Organizational Members](#) are eligible for discounted registration rates, including group rate discounts, and may also be eligible for registration and clinical travel support reimbursement. Discounted rates are available to members through Friday, September 18, 2026.

2026 CHAMPS/NWRPCA Pre-Conference 340B Workshop

The [2026 CHAMPS/NWRPCA Fall Primary Care Conference](#) will include a pre-conference workshop focused on the 340B Drug Pricing Program – **Ready, Set, Deep Dive: What You Need to Know About 340B in 2026**. Taking place on Saturday, October 24, the workshop will provide a full day of engaging, timely, and practical education led by five nationally recognized 340B experts to help health centers navigate the evolving healthcare landscape.

The day will begin with a three-hour morning session that provides a foundational overview of the 340B Drug Pricing Program. Following the morning session, participants will have an opportunity to connect with colleagues and engage directly with presenters during a networking lunch.

The workshop will continue with two sessions incorporated into the regular conference schedule. The first, **Pharmacy Operations, 340B Financial Sustainability & Growth**, will explore best practices for monitoring and optimizing

health center pharmacy programs. The workshop will conclude with **The 340B Policy Landscape: Risks, Opportunities & What's Next**, which will examine current hot topics as well as key regulatory and policy developments.

Separate registration is required for the pre-conference workshop. Individuals may register for the workshop independently or add it to their Fall Conference registration. Workshop-only registration also includes access to the Fall Conference Opening Plenary and Welcome Reception on Saturday evening. 2026 Fall Primary Care Conference Educational Session Highlights

The upcoming [CHAMPS/NWRPCA Fall Primary Care Conference](#) will showcase 46 educational sessions across eight tracks, including:

Clinical: Sessions related to hypertension, care management and coordination in rural communities, substance use services for adolescents, mental health treatments, remote blood pressure monitoring for pregnant individuals, and more.

Finance: Sessions addressing revenue cycle, Medicare Advantage, sustaining Community Health Worker programs, financial modeling, and salary survey results from Region VIII and Region X.

Healthy Communities: Offerings addressing advancing integrated care, building resilient systems of care, community governance in healthcare, care for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, and expanding school-based care through mobile clinics.

Hot Topics: Emerging topics impacting health centers; sessions will be finalized closer to the conference.

HR/Workforce: Sessions focusing on building primary care and maternal health workforces, teambuilding strategies, performance management programs, nursing apprenticeships, and rural healthcare pathways.

Leadership: Sessions addressing artificial intelligence, aligning leadership for greater productivity and financial stability, and more.

Operations: Sessions focusing on the 340B program, emergency preparedness, cyber incidents, responsible artificial intelligence adoption, and more.

The conference will also include a wide range of **networking opportunities**, including receptions, roundtables, and a Networking for Innovation event. Additionally, participants will have the opportunity to attend three engaging **plenary sessions** offered throughout the conference.

Coming Soon: 2026 Region VIII Salary Survey Reports

Every two years, CHAMPS works with the Region VIII State Primary Care Associations to conduct a **Salary, Benefits, Turnover, and Vacancy Survey** of health centers within Region VIII. Data collection for this year's survey took place in the spring. Forty-nine Region VIII health centers, representing 79% of the region, submitted salary and benefits data for 10,470 employees and provided additional data on benefits, vacancies, productivity, and more.

CHAMPS staff are finalizing the **2026 Region VIII Health Center Salary and Benefits Survey Report**, which is on track to be released early this fall. Additional reports addressing clinical staffing ratios, provider productivity expectations, and workforce metrics will also be released in the coming months.

All [CHAMPS Organizational Members](#) will receive one printed copy of the salary and benefits report. Organizations that provided data for the survey will also receive a printed copy, regardless of membership status. Electronic versions of all this year's published reports will be available in the [Members Only](#) section of the CHAMPS website (*Organizational Membership credentials required*).

CHAMPS will host a webinar that will highlight key findings from the survey this fall, and present similar findings during an educational session at the 2026 CHAMPS/NWRPCA Fall Primary Care Conference. During this two-hour case-based workshop, participants learned to recognize normal and high-risk conditions, manage common prenatal and postpartum concerns, and identify when to escalate care.

Update: HRSA Expanding Nutrition Services Funding Opportunity



In July 2026, the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) reannounced the availability of \$125 million in funding to support more the 350 HRSA-funded health centers in expanding access to nutrition services and food-based interventions within primary care settings. Through this [Expanding Nutrition Services](#) funding opportunity, health centers may apply for up to \$350,000 per year for the two-year period of performance. The funding can be used to support a variety of costs, including hiring nutritionists, dietitians, and other providers, providing meal planning education to patients, purchasing supplies to support a teaching kitchen or to start a food garden, and more. Applications are due in [Grants.gov](#) by Wednesday, September 9, 2026. There is no HRSA Electronic Handbooks application phase.

New CMS Interim Final Rule Regarding Medicaid Work Requirements

Beginning no later than January 1, 2027, certain adult Medicaid applicants and enrollees will be required to complete at least 80 hours per month of qualifying activities to enroll in or maintain Medicaid coverage. The requirement applies to 43 states and the District of Columbia that expanded Medicaid and states may choose to implement it before the January 2027 deadline. This was established in an interim final rule issued by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) on June 1, 2026.

Qualifying activities include employment, work programs, education, and community service. Individuals may combine activities to meet the monthly requirement or satisfy it by earning at

least 80 times the federal minimum hourly wage. The rule also establishes new expectations for eligibility, verification, reporting, outreach, and compliance.

New National Technical Assistance Program Awards Announced

On July 28, 2026, the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) announced \$24 million in funding through the 2026 National Technical Assistance Programs (NTAPs) opportunity, with awards made across three categories.

- ★ **Clinical and Preventive Excellence:** [Cicatelli Associates Inc.](#)
- ★ **Operational Excellence:** [National PCA Hub](#)
- ★ **National Technical Assistance and Coordination Center:** [National Association of Community Health Centers](#)

Together, these three NTAPs will provide technical assistance to support existing and potential health centers, with a focus on strengthening the delivery of comprehensive, high-quality primary health care. Their work will assist efforts to improve chronic disease management and preventive services, enhance operational effectiveness, and address emerging public health priorities. The programs will also help health centers meet and exceed Health Center Program and supplemental funding requirements. HRSA previously funded a variety of National Training and Technical Assistance Partners (NTTAP) cooperative agreements. These organizations still support health centers nationwide, and the [National Training Partners Guide](#) provides more information about ongoing collaboration.

National PCA Hub Receives Operational Excellence NTAP Award

The [National PCA Hub](#) was created by and for the nation's 52 Primary Care Associations (PCAs) to strengthen collaboration, resource sharing, and innovation across the health center ecosystem. Building on this foundation, the National PCA Hub recently launched the National Hub for Community Health Center Excellence (NHCHCE), a new initiative dedicated to advancing operational excellence and supporting the long-term success of community health centers nationwide. NHCHCE was created in response to the Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) award of the Operational Excellence National Technical Assistance Program (NTAP) to the National PCA

Hub, a four-year cooperative agreement that positions the National PCA Hub as a national leader in providing technical assistance, training, peer learning, and performance improvement support.

Through NHCHCE, the National PCA Hub will leverage the expertise of PCAs, Health Center Controlled Networks (HCCNs), national partners, and health centers to strengthen workforce capacity, financial sustainability, health information technology, and operational performance, helping health centers deliver high-quality, accessible, and sustainable care.

CAI Selected for Clinical & Preventive Excellence NTAP Award



In July 2026, [Cicatelli Associates Inc.](#) (CAI) was selected by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to receive the Clinical and Preventive Excellence National Technical Assistance Program (NTAP) award. Through this award, CAI will address a broad range of priorities, including chronic disease management, mental and oral health services, clinical quality improvement and patient safety, and more.

To meet health centers where they are, CAI will use a tiered technical assistance delivery model that ranges from broadly available resources to intensive, longitudinal support. Health centers will have access to a variety of digital resources, including toolkits and implementation guides. CAI will also host national webinars featuring practical, evidence-based guidance. These live sessions will be open to all health centers and recorded and archived for later viewing.

In addition, CAI will facilitate eight virtual Communities of Practice, each bringing together 12 health centers for shared learning and problem-solving, along with individualized coaching.

CAI also plans to provide more intensive support through six outcome-focused cohorts, addressing four key areas: controlled hypertension, weight assessment and counseling, cancer screening, and tobacco cessation. Each cohort will take place over a three-year period and include a minimum of 40 health centers, reaching at least 240 health centers across all six cohorts.

Through this tiered approach, CAI will help health centers access evidence-based resources, strengthen clinical practices, and work toward measurable improvements in clinical and preventive outcomes.

HRSA Releases Scope of Project Policy Manual

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) recently published the [Health Center Program Scope of Project Policy Manual](#) (Scope Manual), which consolidates, streamlines, and updates scope of project policies. The Scope Manual provides greater clarity to strengthen programmatic oversight and support faster decision-making, while helping ensure health centers meet program requirements and use federal funds appropriately. HRSA encourages health centers to review this document and use it

when making current and future scope of project decisions and requests, as HRSA will use the Scope Manual to review Change in Scope requests moving forward. In 2027, HRSA will work with health centers to review and confirm approved scopes of project for accuracy. This review may result in corrections or changes to sites, services, or activities to align with the Scope Manual. HRSA Announces New Access Points Awards

On August 13, 2026, the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) announced \$102 million in [New Access Points](#) awards to significantly expand the reach of the Health Center Program. New Access Points (NAP) funding is the primary pathway for organizations to become HRSA-funded health centers while also supporting existing health centers to expand into new communities.

These NAP awards mark the first major expansion of the Health Center Program since 2019, providing funding to 158 new and existing health centers to establish 415 new sites and increase access to comprehensive primary care for nearly one million people nationwide. **Congratulations to [Green River Medical Center](#) (UT) on being selected for an award through this opportunity!**

NACHC Board of Directors: Region VIII Updates

The National Association of Community Health Centers (NACHC) Board of Directors is made up of eight elected officers, two representatives from each of the ten regions, two elected clinician representatives, and two elected health center board members.

To serve on the board, you must:

- ★ Be a current NACHC Individual Member with membership for the previous three consecutive years;
- ★ Be employed by or serve on the board of a NACHC Organizational Member that has maintained current membership for the past three consecutive years, or be employed by a chartered State, Territorial, or Regional Affiliate for the past three consecutive years; and
- ★ Have served on at least two different NACHC committees within the last five years, with a record of at least 50% attendance on each committee.

Elections for the open NACHC Board of Directors Regional Representative seat were undertaken earlier this spring. Wade Erickson, Chief Executive Officer of [Horizon Health](#) in Howard, SD, was reelected by acclamation to the NACHC Board as one of the two Region VIII Representatives and will serve another two-year term through September 30, 2028. John Santistevan, President/CEO of [Salud Family Health](#) in Fort Lupton, CO, will continue serving his two-year term as a Region VIII Representative on the NACHC Board, which expires September 30, 2027. **Thank you both for your service on the NACHC Board representing Region VIII!**

Now Available: State & National 2025 UDS Data

Each year, the Bureau of Primary Health Care (BPHC) collects data from Health Center Program awardees and Look-Alikes through the Uniform Data System (UDS). Participants are required to report a core set of information, including data on patient characteristics, services provided, clinical processes and health outcomes, staffing, costs, and revenues as part of the standardized reporting system.

State and national UDS figures for 2025 were released in early August 2026. CHAMPS compiles the information from the Region VIII states to create a regional summarized history of UDS information, providing two-, three-, and five-year trends of select Region VIII and national data, as well as detailed breakdowns of data by state, region, and nation for the current year. The 2025 Region VIII BPHC UDS Summary as well as a two-page 2025 Region VIII Health Center Fact Sheet will be published by CHAMPS soon.
