






INFLATION REDUCTION ACT OVERVIEW

- The Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) was signed into law in August 2022
- 40% of investments will flow to systemically marginalized communities (Justice40 communities)
- Provides tax incentives (for non-profitselective payments) for clean energy projects, electric vehicles, and others.
- Various grant opportunities for clean energy/lowering emissions, climate resilience
- The IRA extends the clean energy Investment Tax Credit (ITC) to provide up to a 30% credit for investments in solar+storage. There are also various adders (low-income communities, energy communities, etc.)





Bonus Credits Available within the Investment Tax Credit

The federal Investment Tax Credit and its six bonus credits authorized through the Inflation Reduction Act could reduce eligible solar+storage project costs by up to 70 percent.

GOALS OF FUNDING

- Funding community-driven pollution and climate resiliency solutions
- Investing in cross-sectional collaborations
- Unlocking access to more resources
- Delivering technical assistance and capacity-building support
- Strengthening community decision-making power

FUNDING ELIGIBILITY

- A partnership between at least two community-based nonprofit organizations (CBOs)
- A partnership between a CBO and one of the following:
 - Federally-Recognized Tribe
 - Local Government
 - Institution of Higher Education
- Must demonstrate that the projects in their application will benefit a disadvantaged community

APPLICATION INFORMATION

- The EPA is accepting applications on a rolling basis. The deadline to apply is November 21st, 2024
- EPA anticipates awarding approximately \$2 billion in funding for Track I and Track II
- Track I: \$1.96 billion across 150 applicants, with each applicant receiving between \$10-\$20 million each
- Track II: \$40 million across 20 applicants with each applicant receiving \$1-\$3 million each




EPA Environmental Justice Community Change Grants

Track I: Community-Driven Investments for Change

Track I holds the following objectives:

- Climate Action Strategy
- 2 Pollution Reduction Strategy
- Community Engagement and Collaborative Governance Plan
- 4 Community Strength Plan
- 5 Readiness Approach



- Strategy 1: Green Infrastructure & Nature-Based Solutions
- Strategy 2: Mobility & Transportation Options
- Strategy 3: Energy Efficient, Healthy & Resilient Housing & Buildings
- Strategy 4: Microgrid Installation
- Strategy 5: Community Resilience Hubs
- Strategy 6: Brownfield Redevelopment
- Strategy 7: Waste Reduction & Management
- Strategy 8: Workforce Development



Microgrid Installation for Community Energy Resilience and Community Resilience Hubs

Strategy 4: Microgrid Installation for Community Energy Resilience

- Many disadvantaged communities suffer from unreliable access to electricity
- The demand for power is increasing as extreme weather events occur more frequently due to climate change
- Strategy 4 supports the installation of microgrids and builds the community's capacity to prepare for and withstand power outages

Strategy 5: Community Resilience Hubs

- Many disadvantaged communities lack the resources to evacuate when natural disasters occur
- Strategy 5 supports the creation or upgrades to community resilience hubs
- These resilience hubs are to serve the public and provide shelter and essential services during extreme weather and other events that contribute to emergency or disaster





CHARGE Community Health Access to Resilient Green Energy

The CHARGE partnership is ready to help PCAs and health centers with Track I submissions related to solar+storage projects. The CHARGE partnership exists to support health centers to learn about options to design, install, and finance cleaner, reliable, and affordable power. This helps health centers build resilience and keep the focus on caring for patients.
